PIA Fatigue Management

The Ports H&S plan is a tripartite project aimed at improving H&S performance at NZ ports.

The draft plan is currently undergoing consultation with stakeholders. The ports H&S plan identifies a number of focus areas where tripartite project teams will be established to improve health and safety outcomes for all port workers. A pilot project on fatigue risk management is currently underway to both test the new tripartite way of working and to deliver H&S improvements. The following has been confirmed

1. The goal of the project is to reduce the risk of harm from fatigue.
2. The project has tripartite representation with members of the project team from: Maritime NZ, WorkSafe NZ, MUNZ, RMTU, MSG, PIA and the ports of Tauranga and Napier.

A PIA subcommittee has been formed and will be consulted for feedback after each meeting. Please advise the PIA Coordinator if you are interested in joining this sub committee. We currently have 12 people from across the industry on the committee.

Substance Education

Healthy Staff are more productive, have fewer absences and cost you less.

The PIA will be offering a funded workshop that educates around Substance use. It will be a different approach, more around cultural shift not compliance. Health, wellness and we care about you.

We are looking to hold 2 workshops initially for you to send representation and gauge if a good fit for your organisation.

The workshops will be in March 2021, one in Christchurch and one in Tauranga. We will be emailing more info to members early in the new year.

Sponsorship and Associate Membership

As we look to reshape the future direction of the PIA, we will be looking at Sponsorship options to be displayed and available at the Annual conferences. Associate membership is another funding option we are looking at. We will advise as things develop.

Port Security

The PIA after receiving feedback from industry has established a "security sub group" the group will be chaired by the Port Marlborough Port Manager (Principle PFSO) Troy Tane.

The establishment of this group is supported by Maritime NZ, who is committed to engaging with industry with regular attendance and input from their security advisors, it also hoped that other specialist security agencies including police, training providers and equipment providers will also attend from time to time to assist in continuous improvement and information around current threats and risk.

We have scheduled our first meeting for 1st March 2021 9.00am -1400 in Wellington. Further updates will be provided soon.

St Johns Mental Health First Aid

The PIA funded 3 Mental Health first aid courses of which 54 participants from within the industry attended.

There was great feedback and a number of the organisations have engaged with St Johns to run the courses in their own organisations. **Which is fantastic!**

LoadUp offers secondary school students the chance to earn a micro-credential in the Ports and Stevedoring industry approved by NZQA, credits towards NCEA and a great introduction to the workplace.



The industry offers a number of career opportunities – including port administration, cargo handling, and heavy machine operation. Supported by MITO, in partnership with secondary schools and port operators, LoadUp has both eLearning and practical workshop learning. Unit standards completed for LoadUp can be used towards the next step in a MITO ports and

stevedoring traineeship. Upon completion of this programme, students will achieve the LoadUp – Ports and Stevedoring Micro-credential.

We are looking for members to support this initiative and have students work and learn in their organisations for a period of time.
